

There is a lot happening in Colorado recently. We have the University of Colorado Denver, School of Education and Human Development finishing up their first sequence of continuing and professional education courses to help prepare students for their Board Certifications (BCaBA and BCBA). In addition, Colorado's Health Insurance Mandate for Autism Treatment (HIMAT) law has been implemented and insurance companies are beginning to credential BCBA's throughout the state. This law allows BCBA's to independently provide autism services under most Colorado-based insurance plans. Supervision by other provider groups is not required. This law breaks from the national trend to license BCBA's, and may help ease your transition if you relocate to Colorado. He put on a great show for ABAI Expo attendees, to be sure.


